Core Purpose: Mission

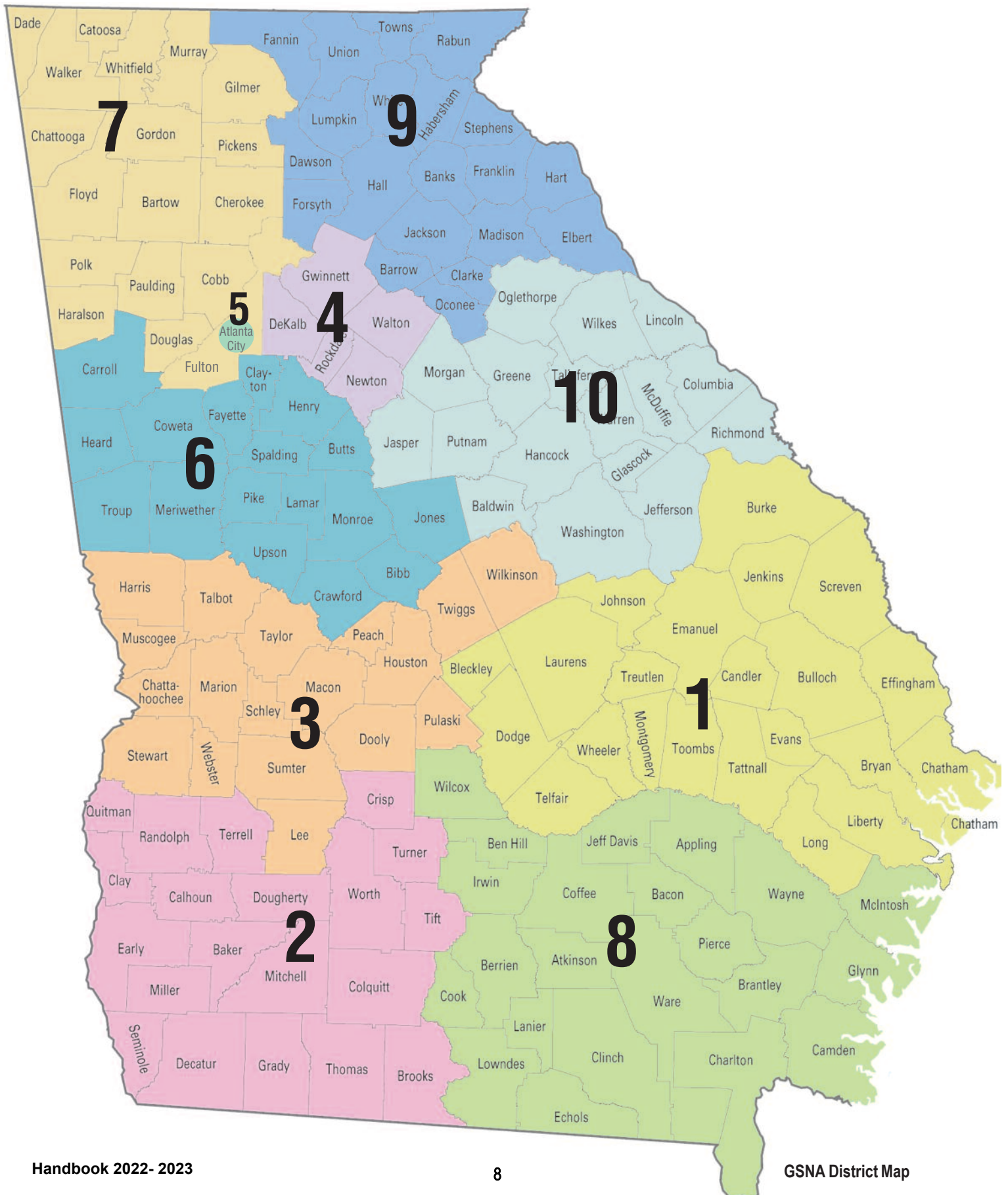

GSN FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS & GRANTS-IN-AID Information Sheet

The Georgia School Nutrition Foundation awards scholarships for undergraduate and graduate study and for grants-in-aid each year. This page provides a brief overview of the eligibility requirements and the application process. PLEASE review ALL items to be sure you meet the requirements to apply. Scholarships and grants-in-aid are awarded three times each year.

What may Scholarships or Grants be used for?

Scholarships are given to use for academic college credit classes, at an regularly accredited college or university that lead to a Master's degree, Bachelor's degree, or Associate's Degree. Courses offered by Georgia Technical Colleges may or may not be considered academic college credit by the Foundation, depending on the specific program and classes taken. The Foundation Trustees will make this determination during the review process. Technical college classes must lead to a degree, not just to a "certificate".

Grants-in-aid may be used for all Technical College courses, expenses such as books, supplies, child care or travel for either academic or continuing education classes or GED classes. Grants in Aid may **NOT** be used to pay for GSNA or SNA meeting/conference registration fees

ALL applicants for undergraduate scholarships **MUST have successfully completed 9 college level semester hours or 15 quarter hours of academic credit before applying.** "AP" (advanced placement) exams or classes taken in high school do NOT meet this requirement. College classes taken at a college while the student is still in high school may be counted for this requirement.

Amounts available:

Scholarships: \$1,000 each. The number of Scholarships awarded is determined each year by the Foundation Trustees.

Grants-in-aid: \$500 each. The number of Grants-in-aid awarded is determined each year by the Foundation Trustees. Grants may be used to sit for the SNA School Nutrition Specialist (SNS) Credential.

WHO is eligible to apply? Those who meet the following criteria:

Member of GSNA and SNA for 1 year

Currently SNA Certified or Credentialed

Grade Average of C or higher for undergraduate scholarships and B or higher for graduate

Children (or grandchildren) of GSNA Members (who meet the above criteria). **Children may ONLY be considered once a year, during the March application period.**

WHEN are applications due?

Members: Three times a year. August 1st, December 15th and March 1st.

Children of Members: Once a year. March 1st.

HOW to apply:

Members - Submit completed Scholarship or Grant in Aid application form for **MEMBERS** with all attachments by either deadline. This includes the completed application form and the following attachments for Scholarships: (a) transcript of college credits with grades (this may be a grade report printed from the internet by the student) and (b) two letters of recommendation (one from immediate supervisor). Recommendation letters **MUST** show the name, title, address, phone number and signature of person writing the letter. The letter may be submitted by e-mail or regular mail.

Children of Members - Submit completed Scholarship application form for **CHILDREN** with attachments by March 1. This includes the completed application form and the following attachments: a) transcript of college credits with grades (this may be a grade report printed from the internet by the student) and (b) two letters of recommendation (one from an academic advisor or instructor.) Recommendation letters **MUST** show the name, title, address and phone number and signature of person writing the letter. The letter may be submitted by e-mail or regular mail. **For questions call 770-934-8890.**

Ann C. Smith Hall of Fame Award

The Hall of Fame is presented annually, and it may be awarded to three people each year who have retired from the field of School Nutrition. It was designed to recognize persons who have made outstanding contributions to the Georgia School Nutrition Association and the child nutrition program.

Who can be nominated?

Nominees must:

- Have reached a minimum age of 60.
- Have retired with a minimum of 10 years of service in the school nutrition program
- Have held at least 10 years of continuous membership in SNA and GSNA prior to retirement

Director of the Year Award

The Director of the Year award recognizes school nutrition directors for the contributions they have made throughout their school nutrition career.

Who can be nominated?

The nominee must be:

- Currently and for the past three years a GSNA/SNA Member at the school district level or in the District Director or Major City Director sections
- Hold a valid state certificate in school nutrition from the Georgia Professional Standards Commission
- The nominee must also have:
 - Served in at least one position on the state or national executive board OR as a member on a state or national committee

Employee of the Year Award/ Golden Leaf (formerly Heart of the Program/Golden Leaf)

The Employee of the Year award recognizes non-managerial school nutrition employees for the contributions they have made throughout their school nutrition career.

Who can be nominated?

The nominee must be:

- Currently a GSNA/SNA member in the School Nutrition or Child Care Employee section such as cook, baker, cashier, assistant, etc.

Josephine Martin Award of Excellence

The Josephine Martin Award of Excellence recognizes a school nutrition leader at either the state level or a local school district program administrator for their outstanding contributions in the management of cost-effective school nutrition programs that provide healthy and appealing meals to students and help them develop healthy food habits. The program administrator position is anyone other than the Director and includes Manager/Supervisors, Coordinators, Specialist and Area Managers. School Nutrition Directors are not eligible as of 2015-2016.

Who can be nominated?

To qualify the nominee/applicant must:

- Be currently employed in the State Department of Education or in a Georgia school system as a Supervisor, Coordinator, Specialist or Area Manager in the School Nutrition Program.
- Have been an active member of SNA and GSNA and have provided leadership and support for District or Local
- Have served in at least one position on the state or national executive board or on an SNA national committee or on a state committee.
- Be involved in their community through networking and alliances to share knowledge and expertise.
- Currently hold a SNA certificate in school nutrition or SNA credentialed.

Who can be nominated?

Local Plan of Action Scroll Preparation Instructions

The Plan of Action (PoA) reflects the message of this year's theme ***"Marching to the Heartbeat of Our Mission"***. Its purpose is to help members connect with existing and new members to improved involvement and access to GSNA events and activities.

The PoA is divided into *four sections* that represent the major focus areas – **Career Development & Growth, Voice of School Nutrition, Stakeholder Community and Thriving Organization**. Each area has several activities that will focus on the work to be conducted and completed by the chapters and districts. The activities are designed to accomplish the work of the Association as outlined in the *State Strategic Goals* and to allow for choices that reflect the needs of the local chapter or district.

Activities listed as Local Scroll Actions have been identified as essential to the success of the association on a local level and are important in strengthening the association at the local level. Each POA receives a completion credit for completing the plan, credit noted on score sheet. **Two additional activities**, called **Electives**, may be conducted in place of the activities listed for each PoA area plan. These activities are intended to allow chapters and districts to conduct activities that best meet the needs of their members. To document electives, place completed documentation and brief description of activity, in each section behind other documents and mark page as 'Elective'.

Gold, Silver, and Bronze scrolls will be awarded based on the number of activities completed. Each plan indicates the number of total activities that must be completed for each scroll award. Each PoA area also indicates the documentation needed for each activity.

Completing the Scroll

You have two options for submitting your scroll: (1) 3 prong folder or (2) electronically via email.
